



WHAT IS PERIODONTAL/ PERI-IMPLANT DISEASE?

Periodontal Disease (or gum disease) consists primarily of two types: Gingivitis and Periodontitis.

Gingivitis is the mildest form of periodontal disease. It causes the gums to become red, swollen, and bleed easily. Untreated gingivitis can advance to periodontitis.

Periodontitis is an infection of the gum and the bone which surrounds the roots of the teeth. It is a leading cause of tooth loss. With time, plaque can spread and grow below the gum line. The tissues and bone that support the teeth break down. Gums separate from the teeth, forming pockets, or spaces between the teeth and gums, that become infected. This destructive process often has very mild symptoms. Eventually, teeth can become loose and may have to be removed.

Peri-implant disease, is similar to periodontal disease but occurs around dental implants.

We can minimize the impact of periodontal or peri-implant disease on your overall health by working together to develop a personalized treatment plan for your specific needs.

TREATMENT OUTCOMES

Periodontal & peri-implant treatment is an investment in your total oral health and a means of preventing tooth or implant loss and avoiding the costs of replacement. By seeking prompt treatment, practicing good oral hygiene and receiving regular dental care, you can retain your good oral health for a lifetime.

WHY IS ORAL HYGIENE IMPORTANT?

It is estimated that about half of Americans 30 years or older have some form of periodontal disease. This equals approximately 64.7 million Americans and the prevalence only increases in adults aged 65 and older to 70.1 percent.*

Adults over 35 lose more teeth to periodontitis than from cavities. The best way to prevent cavities and periodontal/peri-implant disease is by good tooth brushing and flossing techniques, performed daily and routine visits with your dentist.

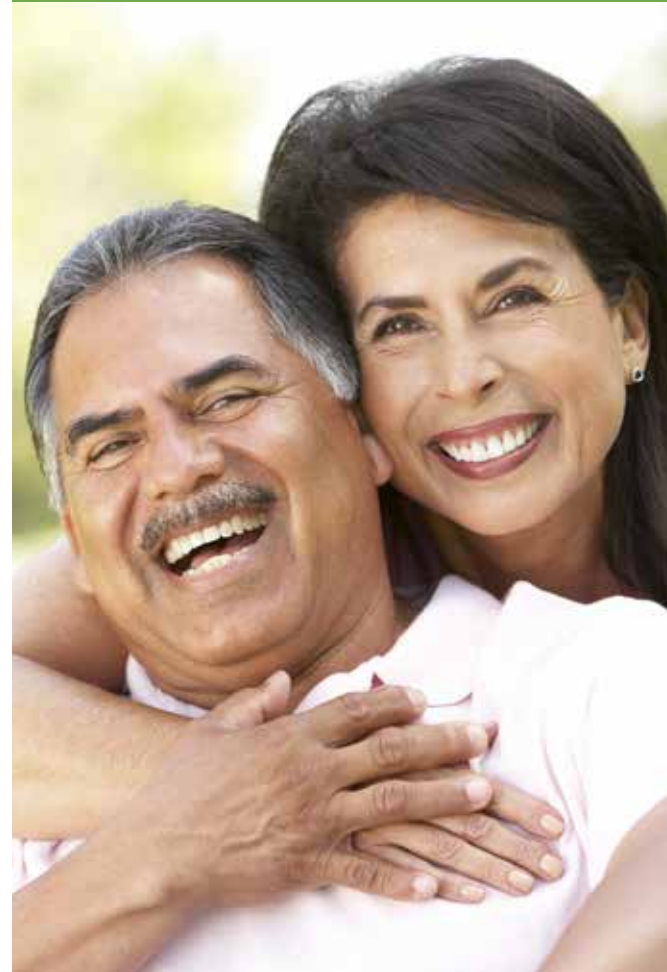
IF YOU NOTICE ANY OF THE FOLLOWING SIGNS, SEE YOUR DENTIST IMMEDIATELY:

- Gums that bleed easily
- Red, swollen or tender gums
- Gums that have pulled away from teeth or implants
- Pus between teeth or implants and gums when the gums are pressed
- Persistent bad breath or bad taste
- Permanent teeth or implants that are loose
- Changes in the way teeth fit together when you bite
- Changes in the fit of partial dentures

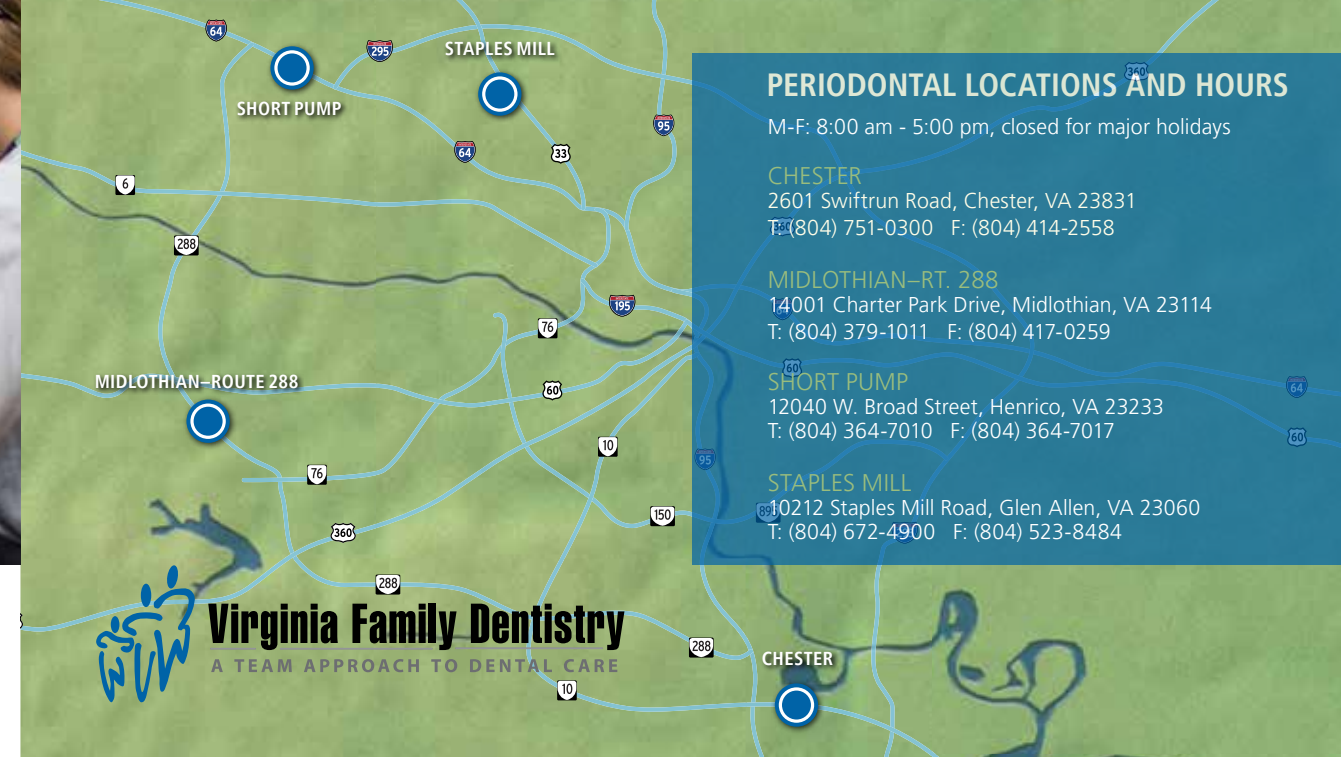
